

The International Children's Peace Prize is awarded annually to a child who fights courageously for children's rights. The International Children's Peace Prize is the most prestigious prize that a young changemaker can receive in recognition of their efforts to move the world. It gives the young winner a worldwide platform to amplify their message and promote causes for the benefit of children's rights. This year the message of the 17-year-old winner Nila Ibrahimi, reached 3.8 bn people worldwide. Each winner is entitled to a study and care grant from the Desmond Tutu Study and Care Fund to enable the winner to obtain an education and to support their siblings and family where needed.

## The Desmond Tutu Study and Care Fund

The Desmond Tutu Study C Care Fund is divided into two components - study component (a scholarship) and a care component.

Study component: The winner of the International Children's Peace Prize receives support from KidsRights in obtaining an education, at least until bachelor level (BA) with also a possibility to apply for funding for master's degree. This support (scholarship) aims to provide an opportunity for the young winner to receive an education. The goal is to give the winner the prospect of developing themselves as much as possible, to prepare for a successful future.

<u>Care component</u>: The care component is available to support the winner and their family in daily and/or to cover additional costs. To ensure the wellbeing of the winner, financial support is made possible by KidsRights from the moment the winner has won. The winner can receive the care fund to support the education of their siblings so that are not left out, or to start an income-generating project for the family or to cover healthcare expenses.
